## “W.I.N” with the HIIN (What’s Important Now) Deadline Approaching: Submit Final HIIN Data

Thank you for your continued participation in the Great Lakes Partners for Patients (GLPP) Hospital Improvement Innovation Network (HIIN) and your ongoing dedication to improving patient care. With the HIIN program formally concluding March 31, the MHA Keystone Center is actively preparing final data reports which will be submitted to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) in mid-March.

In order to provide CMS with the most accurate assessment of the progress made over the past 3.5 years, **please submit National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) and Keystone Data System (KDS) manual entry data by midnight March 9.** The data pulled from NHSN and KDS March 10 will be the last cut of data submitted to CMS for final program evaluation, so please enter any and all data you have by that time, minimally through December 2019.

**Beginning March 10, KDS will be locked for HIIN data processing.** If you have any questions, please email [ihen@team-iha.org](mailto:ihen@team-iha.org).

## **AHRQ Safety Program for Improving Surgical Care and Recovery - Enrollment OPEN for Emergency General Surgery (NEW!) and Colorectal Surgery Programs**

The Johns Hopkins Armstrong Institute for Patient Safety and Quality, in collaboration with the American College of Surgeons, is NOW ENROLLING hospitals for the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) Safety Program for Improving Surgical Care and Recovery (ISCR), a collaborative program to enhance the recovery of surgical patients. The project is funded and guided by AHRQ. There is no fee for hospitals to join!

Interested hospitals are encouraged to begin enrollment NOW in order to participate in the 18-month program that starts March 1, 2020. We are enrolling hospitals interested in implementing an emergency general surgery or colorectal enhanced recovery surgery program.

The ISCR National Project Team has worked with leading experts to come together to bring proven enhanced recovery practices to Emergency General Surgery including laparotomy patients, new for the 2020 cohort!

As part of this program, hospitals will have access to evidence-based enhanced recovery pathways, coaching and content calls with experts in the field, resources to help implement your program, the ACS data collection platform and continuous clinical and implementation support.

The program aims to improve patient outcomes (e.g., surgical site infections, venous thromboembolism, and length of stay) through an integrated approach. Multimodal analgesia that is opioid sparing has been a component, and an additional opportunity to improve opioid stewardship and outpatient multimodal pain control will be introduced with the launch of the cohort 4. Participating hospitals will have access to the following:

- Provider Guidelines for Appropriate Outpatient Opioid Prescribing
- Patient Education on Safe Pain Control after Surgery
- Opportunity to Track Opioid Prescribing with New Variables in the ACS Registry for hospitals participating in the ISCR program

Each year, millions of older adults fall, and over 800,000 patients a year are hospitalized as a result of a fall injury. From 2007 to 2016, fall death rates among adults age 65 and older have increased more than 30%. The rising number of deaths from falls in older adults can be addressed by screening and intervening to address fall risk factors.

During this webinar series participants will learn from expert Pat Quigley about the implementation science of fall injury programs, post-fall management strategies and innovation in fall and fall injury prevention.
