What is Sepsis?

Sepsis is a medical emergency that affects at least 1.7 million adults yearly in the United States. According to the CDC, nearly 270,000 Americans die annually as a result of sepsis and one in three patients who die in a hospital has sepsis. Identifying sepsis is challenging. As a result, time is critical in managing the disease. Delays in diagnosis are associated with severe complications and higher mortality rates. Join the GLPP HIIN and MAPS PSO members for an interactive discussion with content experts from across the country who have successfully implemented evidence based protocols and tools that identify and rapidly treat septic patients.
